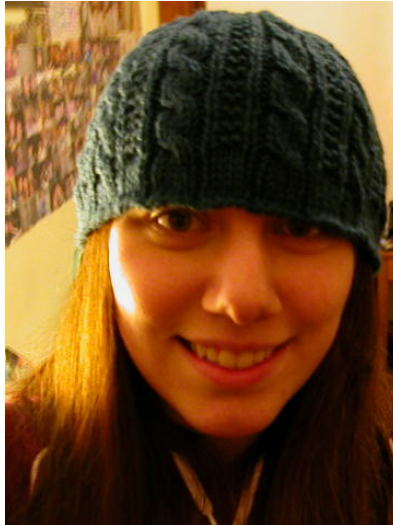


# Katie Hat Pattern

## Materials:

About 150 yards of worsted weight yarn

Size 8 16-inch circular needle and size 8 double-pointed needles (Note: You can use a circular needle and switch to the DPNs when it gets too small for the circular, or you can use the DPNs all the way around.)

Cable needle

Tapestry needle

**Gauge:** 16 sts/4 inches

## Stitches:

C4F: Slip 2 stitches to a cable needle and hold it in front of the work. K2, then K2 from cable needle.

Double decrease: Slip 2 stitches, knit 1 stitch, then pass slipped stitches over the knit stitch.

## Pattern:

CO 110 sts. Join, being careful not to twist.

Work in rib pattern of K4, P1 for 1-2 inches or desired length.

Work Chart A over all stitches 4 times or until the hat measures between 5 and 6 inches, depending on how long you want it to be. End on the last row of the chart.

Follow Chart B for crown decreases. On the last row of the chart, k1 stitch and then work the chart decreases, and at the end of the round, knit the first and last stitches of the round together.

When you are done with the chart, cut a 6 inch tail and pull it through the remaining stitches. Weave in all ends.
